

RoHS2 Directive (2011/65/EU) and Delegated Directive (EU) 2015/863

Directive 2011/65/EU restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic devices. These comprise lead, cadmium, mercury, chromium(VI), poly-brominated biphenyls (PBB) and polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE).

We endeavour to implement these directives for almost all DEHN products, although only a certain part of our product portfolio actually falls within their scope. In some cases, this requires recourse to exemptions.

The Delegated Directive (EU) 2015/863 adds four plasticisers Bis(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate (DEHP), Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP), Dibutyl phthalate (DBP) and Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP) to the above substances. For DEHN as a manufacturer of monitoring and control instruments, a transitional period extended by two years applies until 22 July 2021.

We can already confirm that the majority of our products meet the Directive 2011/65/EU incl. the extension (EU) 2015/863. Detailed information on the products you have requested and details of possible exemptions can be found in a separate table.

With regard to the extended transitional period, we would like to point out that an EU Declaration of Conformity, which also includes the RoHS2 Directive, does not automatically imply conformity relating to the four plasticisers.
